We’re eliminating single use plastics, sourcing sustainable cuisine, installing LED lighting, and much more.

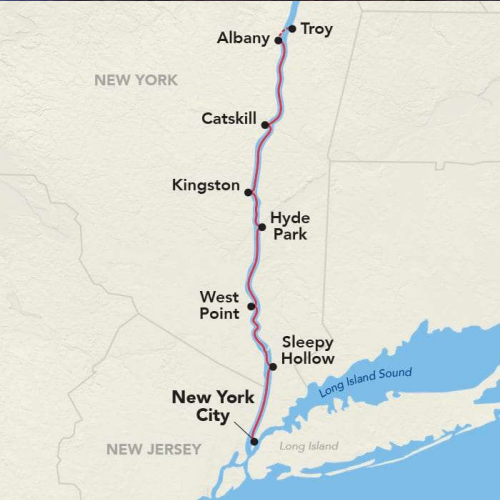
