









### **Proposed Changes**


- Broaden the current 10-knot speed restriction to include vessels 35 feet and above, down from 65 feet.
- Extend the speed restriction zones to cover virtually the entire Atlantic coast, as far as 90 miles from shore.
- Increase the duration of enforcement periods for up to 7 months.

## What can Congress do?

- Pass the bipartisan Protecting Whales, Human Safety and the Economy Act of 2023. (H.R.4323/S.1833)
- Support the FY2024 House Appropriations CJS Subcommittee, which
  provides \$5 million to NOAA for the North Atlantic right whale near real-time
  monitoring and mitigation program and prohibits NOAA from changing
  existing vessel speed regulations until this program is implemented.



#### What can Congress do?

Include provisions in the U.S. Coast Guard Reauthorization Bill to:

- Prohibit vessels Automatic Identification System (AIS) data, information, or transmissions from being used as the primary means of enforcing vessel speed restrictions on recreational boats 65 feet and under; and
- Require NOAA to consult the Coast Guard, along with the National Boating Safety Advisory Committee, to produce accurate economic impact estimates in developing vessel speed reduction rule changes.
